#### Falls Church Branch Highlights – 2016.

For me, the highlight came in November, when we celebrated our 65th anniversary with a gala brunch, reminiscing about AAUW activities in Falls Church since 1950! Kristan McMahon assembles a fantastic collage of photos, clippings, and newsletters telling our story. Claudia Richards, AAUW Senior Branch Relations Manager, reviewed AAUW's proud history and Dr. Cristina Stanciu of Virginia Commonwealth University, current recipient of the FC AAUW funded American Fellowship, was an honored guest at the gala. Local storyteller Colleen Pelar rounded out the program.

But branch activism continues all year. Several members of the Falls Church branch continue their enthusiastic participation in the Capitol Hill Action Fund Lobby Corps, representing AAUW members nationwide. Our members by visit Senate and House offices each week Congress is in session, providing AAUW public policy perspectives in person. In addition, our request for the "Equal Pay Day" proclamation was formally recognized by the Falls Church City Council.

Our annual spring used book sale continues as the major focus of branch activity and philanthropic effort. The sale represents thousands of books and hundreds of volunteer hours attesting to our member's commitment and passion for supporting scholarships. This year we made \$16, 725 profit (on a gross sales of \$21,960.95). The sale funds the scholarships donated to local girls at our May meeting. Finally, this year 1/3 of our branch participated in a member survey to identify important branch activities. Responses show that maintaining friendships is the driver of membership. Diversity was rated as important by 90% of participants. And education/schools was the highest rated meeting topic, followed by science/technology, and "Other" – with an emphasis on LOCAL. We expect that results of this survey will set us on course for another 65 years of service to women and girls in Falls Church.

## Virginia Federal Lobby Day

Thirteen members of the American Association of University Women (AAUW) of Virginia participated in Federal Lobby Day on May 12, 2016. After a thorough briefing by AAUW government relations staff, the 13 women were paired in experienced Lobby Corps volunteers and began their visits to Congressional offices, where they spoke with Members of Congress and/or their staffs about The Women's Health Protection Act and asked them to cosponsor the bill. This measure would preserve and protect access to safe, legal, essential reproductive health care for every woman in the U.S. no matter where she lives. The legislation creates federal protections against state restrictions that threaten women's health and intrude upon personal decision-making.

The AAUW Lobby Corps is made up of AAUW members from the DC metropolitan area who go to Capitol Hill each Thursday Congress is in session to speak to members and their staffs about issues of importance to women and their families. Eight Falls Church Branch members – Marty Behr, Susan Conklin, Marilyn Falksen, Becky Gaul, Peggy Howard, Bunny Jarrett, Kitty Richardson, and Lee Roussel – participate in this program. ### **Time to Renew**

Thank you for being a member of our incredible branch. It's time to renew your membership for 2016-2017. I will be sending out an email reminder in a few days.

You can either pay your dues online or send a check made out to AAUW to Martha Trunk at 6571 Snowbell Lane, Falls Church, VA 22042.

The National dues are \$49 (\$46 of which is tax-deductible, if you itemize your charitable contributions), state dues are \$15 and our branch dues are \$13. Our branch dues have not changed in over 20 years. The total dues are \$77.

Paying online is easy. Click on the link that is in the email. It will take you to a page that has all your information. Enter your credit card information and you're finished. Unless you chose to round up your payment (all tax-deductible if you itemize). This is an easy way to contribute to our Career Development Grant. There is a place under your name that says additional contribution. There is a drop-down box that says select a fund for your contribution. Patiently scroll down the list, past the various AAUW funds, then the individual donors and finally to the second branch designation – Falls Church Area Branch CDG (2010). You can also contribute to an AAUW fund if you pay by check. Let me know your wishes when you send me the check.

This is also a chance to verify your information that is in the database. Please correct it, if necessary, and advise me of the correct information..

And if you know someone who wants to join us, they can join online at AAUW.org but they have to indicate that they are interested in being a MOB (member of branch) and of course, indicate Falls Church Area Branch. We will be notified that we have a new member and we will update our database to make

sure they get our newsletter and other information. Or they can send me a check with their information, including what college or university they attended, when they graduated and the degree they attained.
