Book Drive Closed



Are you wondering where our money goes? Well, our branch provides scholarships to local high schools girls and grants to local organizations helping educate girls. We also donate generously to the AAUW Fellowships (third largest donor in Virginia in 2016).

AAUW is the largest source of funding exclusively for graduate women in the world, supports aspiring scholars around the globe, teachers and activists in local communities, women at critical stages of their careers, and those pursuing professions where women are underrepresented. AAUW awarded \$3.7 million in funding for more than 230

fellowships and grants to outstanding women and nonprofit organizations in the 2016–17 academic year.

This Falls Church AAUW has completed funding the endowment for a career development grant. It joins our fully funded American Fellowship grant that is supporting Amaka Okechukwu's fellowship at George Mason this year. Amaka has received a grant to assist in publishing her thesis: Social Movements, Race and Ethnicity Intersectionality. EQUAL PAY DAY



Equal Pay Day, the symbolic day when women's earnings finally catch up to what white men earned the previous year, falls on Tuesday, April 10, this year. Yes, on average, it took women more than three additional months to earn as much as white men earned in 2017. And, the situation is even worse for women of color. While white women earned 80 percent of what men working full time, year-round earned in 2017, African American women make just 63 percent, Native American women make 57 percent, and Latina women make only 54 percent.

AAUW Branches are recognizing Equal Pay Day in a variety of ways. Our own branch has asked the Falls Church City Council to issue a proclamation designating April 10, 2018, Equal Pay Day and encouraging Falls Church businesses to conduct an internal pay evaluation to ensure women are being paid fairly. The Mayor will sign the proclamation at the City Council meeting on Monday, April 9, and our AAUW branch members are invited to attend. The Council meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the Senior Center of the Falls Church Community Center. Branch members interested in attending are asked to arrive at 7:20 p.m. The issuing of the proclamation will be one of the first items of business, and we are free to leave after the proclamation is presented to us. Of course, anyone who wishes to stay for the entire meeting is welcome to do so.

JOIN AAUW'S DAY OF ACTION

On April 10, AAUW will provide a toll-free phone line that connects equal pay advocates directly to the office of their state senator. Folks who use AAUW's phone line will hear a call script before being connected. The message will be simple: Today is Equal Pay Day and as your constituent, I'm calling on you to pass strong equal pay protections that help to close the gender pay gap.

Advocates – including you! – can commit to joining the Day of Action now by texting the word PLEDGE to phone number 21333 on you cell phone. On April 10, AAUW will send you a

reminder text with a toll-free phone number to reach your state legislator. For those who do not or cannot use text messaging, the toll-free phone line will also be circulated via Action Network email and on social media on April 10.

AAUW is aiming to connect thousands of constituents with their state senators on April 10. Together, we'll deliver a powerful message to legislators that we're ready for meaningful action to close the gender pay gap.

Lobby Corps Recruitment

Lobby Corps is using a new method of recruiting members this year. Rather than having separate training days to which new people are invited, potential Lobby Corps members interested in advocating for AAUW Public Policy Priorities will see Lobby Corps in action by actually going to Capitol Hill and visiting Members of Congress and their staffs. New people will be paired



with experienced Lobby Corps members who will act as mentors and guide the "newbies" as they make their visits. The first Lobby Corps recruitment day will be Thursday, June 21. As the number of new people will be limited to 10, interested individuals will need to sign up in advance. TASK FORCES

Primary Fundraiser Analysis – Five years ago, the branch made a preliminary assessment regarding the viability of the Used Book Sale as our primary fundraiser. One of the recommendations of that report was to revisit the analysis continuously, with the initial target date being five years later. This task force will analyze the book sale viability and propose alternative methods of funding, if deemed necessary, for further exploration.

Book Sale Funds Allotment – A percentage of our Used Book Sale proceeds has been funding a scholarship-related grant at the National-level. We finish paying that grant this year and need to determine how to allocate future proceeds. This task force will propose both a new allocation of the funds and suggest targets for the funds.


Book Club

Falls Church AAUW bookclub will meet on Tuesday 5/15 at 7:30 PM at the Starbucks in Harris Teeter, 301 West Broad St., Falls Church. Please join us for a lively discussion of our History pick: *Secrecy World*. Come even if you haven't read the book; we're witty and fun!

Secrecy World: Inside the Panama Papers Investigation of Illicit Money Networks and the Global Elite by Jake Bernstein

A two-time Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist takes us inside the world revealed by the Panama Papers, a landscape of illicit money, political corruption, and fraud on a global scale. A hidden circulatory system flows beneath the surface of global finance, carrying trillions of dollars from drug trafficking, tax evasion, bribery, and other illegal enterprises. This network masks the identities of the individuals who benefit from these activities, aided by bankers, lawyers, and auditors who get paid to look the other way.

In Secrecy World, the Pulitzer Prize winning investigative reporter Jake Bernstein explores this shadow economy and how it evolved, drawing on millions of leaked documents from the files of the Panamanian law firm Mossack Fonseca--a trove now known as the Panama Papers--as well as other journalistic and government



investigations. Bernstein shows how shell companies operate, how they allow the superwealthy and celebrities to escape taxes, and how they provide cover for illicit activities on a massive scale by crime bosses and corrupt politicians across the globe.

Bernstein traveled to the Caribbean, Latin America, Europe, and within the United States to uncover how these strands fit together--who is involved, how they operate, and the real-world impact. He recounts how Mossack Fonseca was exposed and what lies ahead for the corporations, banks, law firms, individuals, and governments that are implicated.

Secrecy World offers a disturbing and sobering view of how the world really works and raises critical questions about financial and legal institutions we may once have trusted. (less) Hardcover, 352 pages
