
Time to Renew!!

Gender Equity Studies in Our Local Schools



Do you know that Falls Church students are studying gender equity in the workplace? Several 5th grade students at Thomas Jefferson Elementary school studied this issue for a presentation to their school community on May 29 as part of the International Baccalaureate program. The two teams researched information and spoke with "experts" to develop their project. Their local expert was from Falls Church AAUW, Anne Baxter. Anne told them about AAUW's work on gender equity including lobbying Congress for pay equity and the online salary negotiation tools (Start Smart/Work Smart) as well as

her personal story relating to this issue. Teacher Karin Richey was a key assistant in summarizing information so the students could relate it to their research. 
