Let's talk about women's suffrage and the approaching 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment. Should we take a field trip to view and absorb three exhibits regarding the women who sacrificed to achieve the vote for all of us? Current Exhibits include: *Shall Not Be Denied: Women Fight for the Vote* at the Library of Congress; *Rightfully Hers: American Women and the Vote* at the National Archives ; and *Votes for Women: A Portrait of Persistence* at the Smithsonian's National Portrait Gallery.

We have open issues regarding how to proceed with our future fundraising activities for scholarship? Should we request from the IRS status as a 501(c)3 organization in order to solicit donations in cash for scholarships? To solicit donations in-kind for space to sort and store books?

Many of our conversations lead to the book sale. Who would like to have the book sale? Who would like to think of other fund-raising activities? Who would like to split the proceeds from the 2019 book sale in order to award scholarships in 2020 and 2021 while we develop a new approach to fundraising? How about some food and fun? Cinema and food? A trip to One More Page in Falls Church, Politics and Prose or another bookstore to hear an author speak about her work? There is the book club and the movie group, and Hospitality and Scholarship. Participate and stay engaged.

VIRGINIA AND THE ERA

VAratifyERA (AAUW of Virginia is part of this grassroots organization) is working to elect Virginia legislators who will support ratification as well as educating the public on the importance of this issue. As part of that effort, from August 26 (Women's Equality Day) through early November, an #iScream4Equality truck will travel around Virginia,

handing out ice cream and educating voters about the ERA. The effort will focus on the areas of Virginia that have state legislators that opposed ratification last session. Thus, at the present time, no truck is scheduled for the Arlington/Falls Church area (good news for us). If a truck comes to our area, there will be volunteer opportunities. There will be other volunteer activities such as sending postcards, as we did last year.

Lobby Corps and VIRGINIA AAUW FEDERAL LOBBY DAY

Due to budgetary constraints, AAUW Lobby Corps is limiting the number of visits made to Congressional offices. Rather than going to the Hill to meet with Senators and Representatives and their staffs on a weekly basis, Lobby Corps will go to the Hill this fall on just four days: September 19, October 17 and 31, and November 14.

On October 17, members of AAUW of Virginia will join Lobby Corps for their annual Federal Lobby Day. This is an exciting opportunity for all Virginia members to join Lobby Corps in visiting Congressional offices in support of AAUW's public policy priorities. SMARTSTART/ WORK SMART



As you are probably aware, AAUW challenged itself to train 100,000 people in StartSmart/WorkSmart salary negotiations by August 22, 2019. <u>https://salary.aauw.org/</u> AAUW also encouraged all members to take the training and spread the word. The training is still available and the ability to negotiate on one's own behalf is always important.

AAUW writer Beth Haynes, a member of the Board of Directors said: "I thought I didn't need the training. I've been out of the workforce for more than 20 years. But then I started thinking about all of the ways that training in

negotiations could have helped me in the last couple of years. I bought a new car. I helped my 93- year-old friend secure an apartment in an assisted living facility. I'm a certified parliamentarian and I have to negotiate contracts with groups who need parliamentary services. So, the negotiating training really is designed for me." And, she said, "It's probably designed for all of your members as well, regardless of whether they are in the workforce."
