Opportunities to Register Voters

The League of Women Voters of the Fairfax Area (LWVFA) is registering voters and has offered AAUW members the opportunity to join in that effort. State law requires that anyone who registers voters be credentialed each year. The credentialing process is easy and involves watching a 40-minute video and filling out an affidavit stating that you have completed the training. 2021 Election Calendar

AAUW's public policy agenda describes expanding and protecting the right to vote as **foundational** because having the right to vote is a prerequisite to establishing all other policies that AAUW advocates.

To help our members and others exercise their right to vote, AAUW-VA has prepared a flyer with key dates and deadlines for the November election. A copy of that flyer follows this article. Virginia has led the Nation in expanding voter rights, so we can now vote by going to the polls in person on November 2 or by using one of the expanded voting opportunities Virginia offers. The flyer has live links to the Virginia Department of Elections website to help voters find more information and enable them to make their voting plan now.

Falls Church Area Branch of AAUW Urges Voter Participation in the Reclaim Our Vote Campaign

The Reclaim Our Vote ("ROV") campaign of writing postcards began for the Falls Church Area Branch of AAUW ("AAUW FC Branch"), and friends of the branch, in the months leading up to the November 2020 elections. The AAUW FC Branch then continued working with the ROV campaign prior to the special Senatorial races held in early 2021, and since March 2021, has been working directly with the ROV campaign urging Virginia residents to vote in Virginia's November 2021 state-wide elections. During this time, AAUW FC Branch has distributed 10,585 ROV postcards to members. AAUW FC Branch members and friends completed and mailed the ROV postcards to residents and voters in several states with messages that encouraged voter registration, participation in their state and national elections and early voting. The chart below shows the scope of the branch's ROV efforts.

Specifically to encourage Virginia residents to vote in the November 2021 Virginia state elections, AAUW FC Branch restarted our participation in ROV in March and April 2021, mailing 1900 ROV postcards to encourage persons purged from the Virginia voter rolls to re-register, if appropriate, and vote. In August 2021, a second set of 1000 addresses and ROV postcards were distributed to the branch with messaging to encourage Virginia voters to turn out in November 2021. Most of these 1000 ROV postcards are already in the mail.



The branch's ROV postcard writing campaign has been organized and spearheaded by Mollie Jewell, AAUW FC Branch Secretary, with much assistance from Mary Youman, AAUW FC Scholarship Committee Chair. The branch's ROV campaign is in honor and memory of Kitty Richardson, an active civil rights supporter and our former diversity chair, who passed away in early 2021. The branch has worked directly with the Reclaim Our Vote campaign, which is a project of the Center for Common Ground of Virginia, a registered non-partisan 501 (c)3 organization. National partners include NAACP, Black Voters Matter, Mi Familia Vote, VoteRiders and DemLabs.




