We have several new members who are joining us for a first or second meeting. All of us are really looking forward to meeting you on **Monday**, **September 11 at 7:30 p.m**. at the Falls Church Community Center! We will also look to the future: new plans, new projects, new budget, new fundraisers as well as tried-and-true endeavors to address recurring and high stakes issues.

What is our focus? What are our goals? In 1881, AAUW was founded to open the doors for women's career advancement and to encourage more women to pursue higher education. Today, our mission is much broader: "advancing gender equity through research, education and advocacy." This broad mission includes, but is not limited to, goals regarding:

EDUCATION and TRAINING (equal access in education, emphasizing STEM, ensuring education at every level is free from sex discrimination)

ECONOMIC SECURITY (shrinking the gender pay gaps, bolstering inclusive career pathways for women in skills and training)

LEADERSHIP (expanding the number of women in leadership, particularly in STEM)

GOVERNANCE AND SUSTAINABILITY (implementing continuous improvement and best practices in governance, inclusion, embodying the goals and spirit of equity, diversity, and intersectionality across all AAUW activities, prioritizing women of color)

ENHANCE FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY (see AAUW's Strategic Plan 2.0 (www.aauw.org)

We have much to accomplish this year to meet our goals as well as have some fun!

On September 11, 2023, we will discuss two fundraisers. First, the Jewelry Sale. **The Jewelry Sale** is spearheaded by Marion (Bunny) Jarrett and Mary Ellen Gannon, and will occur on <u>Saturday, September 23</u>. AAUW Falls Church pg. 1

Bunny and Mary Ellen will be seeking volunteers to help prepare the donated merchandise and sell it—jewelry, scarfs, and small purses/evening bags.

A second fundraiser, **BloomBox.com**, will occur from <u>September 1 through September 30</u>, and is an online plant sale. The branch gets a percentage on each order that includes our "code." We hope all members participate by sharing the marketing materials we will send you (which include the "code" AAUW15) provided by Bloombox with friends, neighbors, and local groups, and maybe buying a chrysanthemum or two.

Why do we raise these funds? Because our most thrilling annual activity is giving away the money we raise annually to a group of stellar high school seniors, many of whom are first generation immigrants, and who want and deserve to go to college and need much financial assistance. It's the "feel good" meeting of the year and all of us want to continue the scholarship tradition.

We are also facing **Virginia Elections**, which will occur on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 7, 2023</u>. Continuing a great tradition, Falls Church Area branch is again participating in the Reclaim Our Vote post-card writing campaign organized by The Center for Common Ground. Our branch continues to break records! This set of ROV cards urge VA voters to consider where the candidates in their jurisdiction stand on important issues: reproductive rights and freedoms, voting rights, access to jobs, and education. This is an August and September activity, designed to reach voters as early voting begins in Virginia. Sign up for some postcards! See Mollie Jewell at the meeting.

AAUW – VA has also been busy helping our members to prepare for the November VA elections. Jeanine Greeenwood and Denise Murden, Co-VPs for Public Policy, AAUW-VA, asked members to assist in preparing guides on candidate positions on reproductive rights, the ERA, workforce and paid leave issues, voting rights, and education. There may still be time to participate regarding candidates running for the Virginia Senate or the Virginia House of Delegates.

PUBLIC POLICY UPDATES



November 7 is Election Day in Virginia!

Every seat in the Virginia General Assembly is on the ballot this year, and AAUW-VA is working hard to ensure that Senators and Delegates who support our public policy priorities are elected. Due to the large number of retirements at the end of the 2023 Session and the redistricting that has taken place, many Virginians are not familiar with the candidates running in their districts. Thus, several AAUW-VA members are working on voter guides for the Virginia Senate races so that voters will be aware of how the candidates on their ballot stack up against AAUW-VA public policy priorities. The voter guides should be available in mid-September.

If you are not sure which Senate and House of Delegate districts you are in after redistricting, just go to <u>https://whosmy.virginiageneralassembly.gov</u> and put in your address. You will then see your current legislators and district numbers. Since most of the districts have been renumbered, even if you legislators have not changed, you will need to click on "new in …" to see your new district numbers.

Lobby Corps

After a three-plus-year hiatus, Lobby Corps is back! On July 27, fourteen Lobby Corps members visited Members of Congress, asking them to sign the discharge petition to ensure a House vote on House Joint Resolution 25 in support of the Equal Rights Amendment. After their visit, 15 additional Members of the House signed the petition! Future Lobby Corps visits are scheduled for September 21, October 19, and November 16.

For AAUW members that are unfamiliar with Lobby Corps, here is a brief summary of the group and an invitation to learn more about joining.

Since its formation in 1972, AAUW Action Fund Lobby Corps volunteers have made tens of thousands of inperson visits to congressional offices on behalf of AAUW members and supporters in their respective congressional districts, placing a name and a face to our mission of advancing equity for women and girls. Lobby Corps volunteers are trained in how to effectively advocate for AAUW's priority issues with members of Congress and their staff. Volunteers receive briefings on each issue before going on visits, and new Lobby Corps volunteers are paired with experienced members. Capitol Hill Lobby Days are typically held once a month when Congress is in session.

AAUW members and college students in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area are welcome to join Lobby Corps. No experience or expertise is necessary—only a commitment to promoting AAUW's nonpartisan public policy priorities. Update on Court Case Regard Mifepristone

On July 16, the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals limited access to the drug mifepristone, which is used for abortions in place of surgery, by ruling that the FDA had overstepped its authority when it made the drug mifepristone easier to obtain by allowing prescriptions without a doctor's visit and the drug to be dispensed through the mail. The Court's ruling, however, will have no immediate effect on access to the drug as an earlier Supreme Court decision said that the drug could continue to be available until the case is heard and decided by the Supreme Court, which could occur during the Court's next term beginning in October.

<u>GET OUT THE VOTE POSTCARDS 2023</u>

Postcard writing for the fall elections has started! Signup now.

On Sept 9, I'll order more addresses for postcards for the Virginia general elections. We have already written cards to 500 voters in Stafford County, new addresses will be in a different area in Virginia. A typical sample is below. The <u>due dates are between September 8th - October 30th</u>. So, very doable.

If you want to write postcards, tell me how many postcards (multiples of 20) and if you want stamps. These should be ready at the Sept meeting, and afterwards at my house.

Remember, we are writing to registered BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) voters to alert them to this crucial election. 100 House of Delegates and 40 Senate seats are up for election. Once the seat of the Confederacy, Virginia became a stronghold of voting rights in 2021, which is now under threat, along with AAUW Falls Church pg. 5

education that includes Black history, and restoration of rights to returning citizens. For now, VA has the least restrictive abortion laws in the South (26-28 weeks). We can help safeguard and expand hard-won civil rights by increasing BIPOC participation in elections. Postcards inform voters of where and when to vote, and key issues at stake.


