# May Madness: Pick your Bracket



Last month's President's letter was about bricks and walls. This month my thoughts go to brackets–like in basketball's March Madness. We are not selecting our favorite team or our alma mater but experiencing our own May Madness. From fundraising to scholarship awards, we have been crazy busy. Along the way, we have made tough decisions. In our case, our bracket ends with our branch's success.

May Madness begins on May 3rd and May 4th, as we host a Book and Jewelry Fundraiser at the Falls Church Community Center. Thank you for donating books and jewelry, getting the word out about the sale, and working before and during the sale. Sign up to help via <u>this link</u>. Then, on May 5th you decide WHERE (La Taverna Westover or Market), WHAT (check the menu), WHEN (open hours), WHO (members, family, friends) and HOW (eat in or take out or gift card) to support our fundraising. Between 10:00 AM - 3:00 PM take a self-guided tour through Cherry Hill Park and visit 67 "Her Story" stations. Each station represents the Falls Church Women's History "All-Stars", showcasing their stellar contributions to our community from the 1600s through today.

# **PUBLIC POLICY UPDATES**

#### Virginia General Assembly



Last month's newsletter reported that AAUW-VA's public policy agenda fared well in the General Assembly (GA), which passed and forwarded to the Governor many of the bills we supported. However, only a few of them were signed by the Governor and enacted into law, including expanding the use of electronic meetings, privacy for menstrual tracker apps, expansion of Maternal Health Review teams, support for higher education students reporting bullying, same sex marriage protections, and ending legacy admissions at state colleges and universities. Additionally, two measures AAUW-VA did not actively support but are of interest to many AAUW members -legislation combating labor trafficking and ending child marriage

which was often a path to sex trafficking -- were signed into law.

When the General Assembly (GA) returned to the Capitol on April 17 to act on the Governor's vetoes and on his proposed amendments to the bills and budget the GA had passed, the legislators were unable to garner the 2/3 majority needed to override the vetoes. Thus, Paid Family and Medical Leave Insurance and a ban on employers requiring past salary history from prospective employees (two bills AAUW has long championed) failed to become law. Also failing to become law due to a veto were bills increasing the minimum wage, banning disciplinary action against doctors for providing abortion care, banning extradition based upon providing abortion care or related services, requiring employers to give employees notice of deadlines to file discrimination claims, and allowing a voter-approved local sales tax to support school construction and renovation.

Additionally, the legislators had proposed to the GA-passed bills. Bills of importance to AAUW in this category include measures to enshrine in Virginia law the right to obtain contraception, require health insurance companies to cover contraceptive drugs and devices, require unconscious bias and cultural competency training for medical professionals, expand the STEM Education Advisory Board's duties to include encouraging participation in STEM by underrepresented students, establish a Community School Office in the Department of Education, and develop Title IX and sexual harassment training modules for 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders. The Governor now must either sign or veto them by May 17; if he does nothing, the bills will automatically become law.

The legislators and the Governor reached an agreement on the budget to which the Governor had proposed over 200 amendments. Rather than dealing with the amendments, the parties agreed to create a new two-year spending plan, based on the GA's budget but taking the Governor's priorities into account. Negotiations are currently underway to develop a new budget, with the plan to have it finished by May 13. Currently, the GA is scheduled to vote on the new budget on May 15. Many of AAUW-VA's legislative priorities pertaining to education are in the budget, so their fate won't be known until the budget is passed by the GA and signed by the Governor.

For more than fifty years, Lobby Corps has put a face to AAUW's mission of advancing equity for women and girls, and you're invited to join this dynamic group of committed women! Lobby Corps gives you the tools and resources to amplify your voice and your impact. And, you get to do it with other gender equity advocates in your community.

A virtual training is scheduled for **June 4 at 5:00pm ET**. <u>Register on Zoom</u>. by clicking on the underlined words.

Lobby Corps members have made tens of thousands of in-person visits to congressional offices on issues including Title IX, pay equity, reproductive rights, and the Equal Rights Amendment. Lobby Corps is only a two-hour commitment once a month and generally meets on Capitol Hill on the third Thursday of each month when Congress is in session. Volunteers receive in-depth information about the issues and are paired with experienced Lobby Corps members for office visits.

Falls Church AAU continues our 2024 nonpartisan, get-out-the-vote efforts by writing postcards for VIRGINIA primaries. As usual, we are joining Reclaim Our Vote's <u>ROV</u> campaign to increase Black voter participation. **How can you participate?** Just respond to this email and send an email ("postcard" in the title) to <u>MollieJewell2@gmail.com</u> with:

1. Number of cards you want to write (multiple of 20, please)

2. Number of stamps you need, if any

**What are we doing?** We will be writing to Black voters in Chesterfield VA. Remember, as a non-partisan, we aren't telling people for whom to vote, but we will let them know that a primary is happening and encouraging them to vote. Voting in the primary increases the chances that a person will vote in the general election -- our ultimate goal.

Mailing window: April 26-June3.

**Why is this so important?** In voter suppression states, legislators have passed laws making it harder for people to vote, especially voters of color. With personalized postcards, we are giving voters of color the information they need to cast their ballots despite barriers to voting (and phone calls and text messages). ROV contacts ALL voters of color in the states we work in. By all voters, we mean not just the voters who vote every year, but every registered voter who has a chance to cast a ballot because we know every voice deserves to be heard!

By November 2019, it had sold 11.5 million copies.<sup>1288</sup>A documentary titled <u>Becoming</u>, which chronicles Obama's book tour promoting the memoir, was released on <u>Netflix</u> in May 202 She received the <u>Grammy Award for Best Audio Book, Narration &</u> <u>Storytelling Recording</u> in 2020 for the audio book.<sup>1201</sup>

Obama's next book, <u>The Light We Carry: Overcoming in Uncertain Times</u>, was published in November 2022. In 2023, Obama received <u>Primetime Emmy Award for Outstanding Hosted Nonfiction Series or</u> <u>Special</u> nomination at the <u>75th Primetime Creative Arts Emmy Awards</u> for the Netflix documentary film *The Light We Carry: Michelle Obama and Oprah Winfrey.*

Once they stopped moving around every few years, Kate was able to put her MSW degree to work. First, she worked as a geriatric social worker in Reston, working with low-income seniors and then as a social work consultant to the Senior Living Foundation of the American Foreign Service.

The Auberts have four children and five grandchildren, with several living locally. Besides keeping up with her larger family here, Kate is a member of several book clubs and is an "intentional" walker.

### **Conference Notes from Sharon**

Dr. Alison Morrison-Shepard, University of Lynchburg's first woman president, spoke on "Courageous Leaders", which included styles of leadership. Styles of leadership include leading from the front, the side, and from behind. Leading from behind is being a mentor, or providing resources for another or a group to bring their expertise and skills to the table and giving full credit to those who led.

She discussed service leadership.

- Women are and have always been in the business of changing lives.
- Women are strong leaders and need to be strong mentors.

A leader has to be committed to doing the right thing for the right reason and "be confident" (at least, exhibit confidence), even when feeling like a "hot mess" inside. Ex: assuming leadership of the university as Covid began and trying to make the right decisions as federal policies developed and changed about how universities should respond to the disease to protect their faculty, staff, and students. You must make decisions as a leader even when those decisions make you a target.

What to tell young people when they ask you why they should go to college or get more education: Education takes you to your imagination and allows you to fulfill your wildest dreams.

"I believe in pathways, and there are many pathways to achieve your wildest dreams."
