IT'S TIME FOR ELECTIONS!

The first meeting of the year of our FCAAUW branch will be held on Sunday, September 14 at 2:30 at Mary Riley Styles Library lower-level Conference Room. In response to the expressed interest of our members at our June planning meeting, we will start the year with a focus on elections and governance.

To expand our knowledge of election options, we are pleased to have a presentation on ranked choice voting (RCV) by two members of the LWV of Arlington who are affiliated with the democracy reform organization UpVote Virginia. Chris DeRosa and Janice Morris will explain how RCV works and lead us in an activity to demonstrate the voting process. The Virginia General Assembly passed a bill to amend the Code of Virginia § 24.2- 673.1 in July 2020 to allow localities to implement ranked choice voting in elections of members of a county board of supervisors or a city council. RCV has been used in primary and general elections in Arlington.

We next will focus on our recently established **partnership with the LWV-FC** to support the League's voter registration events and candidate information forums this Fall. League and AAUW member Linda Lawrence has volunteered to be the liaison between LWV and AAUW. Linda will offer specific opportunities for our members to be involved in non-partisan election work. Several of our members have completed the voter registration certification program and are ready to volunteer!

Many of our members participate regularly in volunteer lobbying at the national level through the AAUW National **Lobby Corps**, chaired by our own Becky Gaul. Bonnie Krajeski and Aida Loomis, two of our members who are Lobby Corps volunteers will describe the process of joining Lobby Corps and take us through a typical day lobbying on Capitol Hill.

Our lobbying activities also encompass the Virginia legislature. Marilyn Falksen, AAUWFC Policy Chair will review the legislative and policy issues AAUW-VA will be following this year. She will invite us to join AAUW members from all over the state for the annual **Lobby Day** in Richmond.

We look forward to seeing everyone at the September 14th meeting!



Healing the Gender Divide: a Community Forum

Moderated by: American Association of University Women, Falls Church Branch
November 6, 2025: 7 to 9 pm, location TBD



A Two-part Community Forum: Healing the Gender Divide What's Going on and How Do We Address It?

A spring survey of our member's programming interests identified a concern regarding what was perceived as a growing animosity with regard to women in our culture, and a desire to learn more about root causes and possible working solutions to address the issues. The result of the survey is a two-part public forum moderated by our Falls Church branch and sponsored by American Association of University Women of Northern Virginia: Falls Church, Alexandria, Arlington, Fairfax, Manassas, McLean, Mount Vernon, Reston/Herndon, Springfield/Annadale, and Vienna. We also hope to obtain sponsorships from the American League of Women Voters and other Falls Church organizations, as well as secure an AAUW Virginia mini grant.

The first forum will take place on **November 6, 7:00-9:00 pm**, venue to be determined. Experts from Equimundo: Center for Masculinities and Social Justice https://www.equimundo.org/, and the Center for American Progress, Women's Initiativehttps://www.americanprogress.org/ will present the research on root causes and discuss the role of social media as a causal influence. Feedback from local educators and counselors will then laser-focus the global problem home, discussing what's happening in our own schools, and neighborhoods.

The second forum will be held next spring and will address solutions and means to become engaged.



Background

Virginia will likely be the only campaign for the rest of the year. And, as you know, it is the most consequential election in 2025, with the offices of Governor, Lieutenant Governor, State Attorney General, the entire House of Delegates, and various municipal and school board seats at stake.

Early voting starts Friday, September 19 to Saturday, November 1. Election Day is Tuesday, November 4.

Why is FC AAUW postcarding? FC AAUW started this project to honor the memory of Kitty Richardson, a FC AAUW member and civil rights activist, and in furtherance of AAUW's public policy priority to "support open and fair elections that are broadly accessible to all voters." We write the cards in cooperation with Reclaim Our Vote (ROV) and Center for Common Ground, 501c(3) nonpartisan organizations.

Candidate Forums for VA House of Delegate Elections. The League of Women Voters-Fairfax ("LWV") is sponsoring candidate forums for candidates running for the Virginia House of Delegates in our area. AAUW-VA is a co-sponsor of these events, which occur in September and early October. The LWV and AAUW urge you to tune in and hear the candidates explain their positions. Some of the events are virtual (via Zoom), and others are televised and will be viewable on Fairfax Public Access Television Channel 10.

AAUW volunteers are sought for the televised forums on <u>Sept. 22</u>, <u>Sept. 29</u>, and <u>October 6</u> (*See Calendar for specific times*). The LWV would like one volunteer/per candidate forum from our organization.

Location of volunteer activity and arrival time: The arrival time is 7 p.m. for a televised forum starting at 8:00 p.m. The location is Fairfax Public Access Television Channel 10 Station, 2929-S Eskridge Road, Fairfax, VA 22031. Parking is available in front of the studio.

Attire and identifying organization badges: Business casual with comfortable shoes is recommended. Organization name badges are permitted. Do not wear paraphernalia or campaign gear and buttons. Individuals without a name badge will be provided one.

Assignment(s) description. The LWV will let you know specific tasks when the LWV sends out volunteers' instructions before the event. Possible assignments include: (1) Telephone Room: Record call-in questions with a League representative; (2) Conference room: Monitor campaign representatives and personal belongings. Also, can watch the forum on a TV screen.

To help our fellow citizens prepare for the critical elections this fall, the Falls Church AAUW is joining the Falls Church League of Women Voters (LWV) to register voters, distribute information on the election at community events.

The LWV is currently planning registration outreach events that will provide opportunities for FC AAUW to get involved. Interested members were previously asked to complete the Virginia Dept. of Elections <u>required</u> on-line training to be certified to register voters at an organized registration drive. The certification must be renewed every year in order to be valid.
