Healing the Gender Divide in the Era of Pervasive Social Media November 6 Branch Meeting

At our planning meeting in June, our members expressed concern about the impact of social media on the emotional development of young men and women. In response to that concern, a Program Committee of Mary Ellen Gannon, Bunny Jarrett, Anita Booth, Sue Christie, and Clare O'Sheel have developed a two-part community forum: Healing the Gender Divide in the Era of Pervasive Social Media.

The first forum will address the state of boys/men and the state of girls/women in our society, particularly how misogyny affects gender equity and the power of social media in reinforcing harmful gender attitudes. A representative of Equimundo https://www.equiundo.org, (a research organization which recently published The State of American Men 2025) will discuss the complex crisis of boyhood and manhood. A representative of the Center for American Progress, Inclusive Economy, https://www.americanprogress.org will focus on the "state of girls and women" and the impact of misogyny and corrosive social media on the lives and livelihoods of girls and women.

The first Community Forum will be held **November 6, 2025, 7:00 - 9:00 PM at Mary Ellen Henderson Middle School, Falls Church.**

A second forum to be scheduled in spring 2026 will address solutions and means to become engaged. Feedback from local educators and counselors will laser-focus the global problem, discussing what's happening in our own schools and communities.

We have attached a flyer about the Community Forum, and we encourage you to invite your friends and family to attend. We will ask you to post flyers in neighborhood businesses, community centers, and libraries in October. If you can help with flyer distribution in your area, please contact Bunny Jarrett. Because this is such a relevant topic, we are working to attract young men and women, parents, school counselors and social workers, AAUW-VA branch members, and other interested community members.





On Tuesday, October 14, 2025, 7 pm, the first virtual All-District meeting for this year will be presented: One Person, One Vote: The National Popular Vote vs. The Electoral College. This program will be presented by Jane D. Newell, Greater Richmond Branch (GRAAUW) AAUW Funds Chair, as well as Director of Transformation for the League of Women Voters of Virginia (LWVVA). "Five times in our history, the presidential candidate with the most popular votes wasn't elected. That's because the people do not elect presidents—the Electoral College does." Jane will provide a fascinating program on the current system and the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact to abolish the Electoral College.

VOTE!



Early voting has begun in Virginia for the November election. This is an important election as Virginians will be voting for a new Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Attorney General as well as the entire House of Delegates. The success of AAUW-VA's public policy agenda will depend on the outcome of the election, so it is vital that everyone votes and encourages friends, neighbors, and relatives to do likewise. To determine where to vote either on Election Day, November 4, or where and when to vote early, go to this link: https://www.elections.virginia.gov/casting-a-

<u>ballot/polling-place-lookup/</u> and enter your address. Early voting ends on November 1; the General Election takes place on November 4. Whether you vote early or on November 4, be sure to make your voice heard by voting!

Let's Celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month

Diversity is something our branch celebrates. We neither ignore nor cancel differences. We learn about different cultures through books and films. In October the movie and book groups will meet virtually to discuss the novel and film *Like Water for Chocolate* by Laura Esquivel. The book and film follow the story of young Tita who lives on a ranch in Northern Mexico at the beginning of the twentieth century, during the Mexican Revolution. She longs to marry a neighbor, Pedro but her stern mother refuses to give her permission and insists that as the youngest, Tita must care for her until her death. Tita's forbidden love for Pedro blossoms and is expressed through the meals she makes. And there the magic begins.

While rewatching the film Like Water for Chocolate (I have yet to read the book, but I will), I could not help but remember another book that we read several years ago, American Nations by Colin Woodward. The book puts forth a view that the US is a federation of 11 nations each defined by shared culture and established by their founders. Like Water For Chocolate takes place in one of those nations, El Norte which includes land north and south of the Rio Grande River. And that nation is where my American family story begins.
